RECYCLING

Marion Utilities Recycling Center

Hours: Monday & Friday from 11 am - 6 pm

All recyclables should be empty, clean and dry. As long as markets are available, the following materials are recyclable at Marion Utilities:

- Paper shredded paper, newspaper, magazines, envelopes, junk mail
- Cardboard shipping boxes, cereal boxes and the like, toilet paper rolls
- Glass bottles and jars clear or colored, caps off
- Aluminum and steel cans and lids labels okay
- Plastics #1 #2 & #5 labels okay, caps off
- Cooking oil—used or unused
- Books- soft cover and hardback

NOT accepted: any containers with food residue; plastic bags or Styrofoam; hoses, hard, or large plastic items that are difficult to bale

TRASH COLLECTION TOTERS

Marion Utilities Solid Waste

Trash collection toters are for regular household trash only. Place all trash in bags and place bags inside the toter.

Do NOT place the following in the toter:

- Dirt, rocks, etc.
- · Grass clippings or leaves
- Construction debris
- Metal or electronic items
- Hazardous waste (i.e. paint, flammables, pesticides, oil)

Materials that are accepted that customers often ask about:

- Grease, fat and oil—cool grease, scrape into a can, allow to solidify, put in trash
- Food scraps—meat and dairy
- Wipes—even those that are "flushable"
- Sharps—when a take-back event is not available.
 Place in puncture proof container & place in trash.
- Batteries—alkaline only
- Cat litter and pet waste in bags
- Latex paint—let paint dry in can and dispose
- Small electronic items—as long as they do not have a digital display, circuit board or rechargeable battery



DRAINS TO SANITARY SEWER

By design, Wastewater Treatment plants treat human waste and household cleaning wastewater. Most other waste generated should be otherwise disposed. Materials that cause sewer and drain problems include:

- Grease, fats, oils
- Paper towels, baby wipes, "flushable" wipes, sponges
- Feminine napkins, tampons, plastic applicators, condoms
- Disposable diapers or clothing
- Plastic bags or wrappers
- Hazardous waste—cleaners, beauty products, auto fluids, paint, lawn care products
- Medicine or sharps
- Substances that can swell with water rice, corn, oatmeal, cereals
- Fibrous materials cotton balls, bandages, hair, rags, cigarette butts
- · Grass clippings and yard waste in the street

DRAINS TO STORM SEWER

Storm drains are holes or openings at the curb or in parking lots, usually with a grate over them, leading to underground pipes that carry rainwater <u>untreated</u> to a stream or river. Use and properly dispose of litter, pesticides, animal waste, oil, and other chemicals placed in driveways and yards so they do not end up in the river. Do not put glass clippings and yard waste in the street.



COMPOSTING AT HOME

The following are acceptable items for the compost pile:

- Coffee grounds, crushed egg shells, fruit, fruit peels and rinds, peanut shells, pumpkins, vegetable scraps, tea grounds and leaves
- Feathers, hair, lint
- Paper—non-recyclable
- Garden debris, grass clippings, leaves, lake weeds, hay, straw

The following are materials to avoid in the compost pile:

- Cat litter, pet waste
- Charcoal and briquettes
- Bones, cooked food waste, dairy products, fatty oily greasy foods, fish scraps, meat, peanut butter
- Paper—glossy colored

CONSTRUCTION DEBRIS

Construction and demolition debris may be brought to the transfer station. Cost varies by material and quantity. Heavy construction and demolition debris is not accepted (concrete, cinder blocks, bricks, dirt, or masonry materials).

Marion Utilities allows for one free large item pick up per month. A large item may be a sofa, table, mattress, washer, empty burn barrel, etc. Call to schedule a pick up.



The large item pick up does NOT include:

- Appliances with Freon
- Batteries
- Oils, paints and solvents
- Tires
- TVs and electronics
- Burn barrel contents

LARGER QUANTITIES OF TRASH

(I.E. CLEANING OUT THE GARAGE, MOVING)

When generating more trash than will fit in a toter, excess trash may be brought to the transfer station. Cost varies by the quantity of material.

- Oils, paints and solvents
- Tires
- TVs and electronics
- Yard waste

Mega bags may be purchased when cleaning out a house or garage. The bags hold up to 3000 pounds. Contact Marion Utilities to get a Mega bag.

Do NOT put the following items into a mega bag:

- Electronics
- Freon appliances
- Yard waste
- Heavy construction debris (concrete, cinder blocks, bricks, dirt, or masonry materials
- Household hazardous waste
- Paint cans/spray cans

HOUSEHOLD HAZARDOUS WASTE

Household Hazardous Waste is waste material from any container labeled caution, warning, danger, or flammable.

Household hazardous waste accepted includes:

- Cleansers, Oven Cleaners, Drain Openers, Furniture & Metal Polish
- Nail Polish Remover, Personal Care Products, Shoe Polish
- Pesticides, Herbicides, Poisons
- Paint Remover, Paint Thinners, Varnishes, Stains, Oil Based Paint, Glues, Fixatives, Solvents
- WD-40, Fuel, Motor Oil, Car Wax, Oil Filters, Antifreeze, Brake or Transmission Fluid
- Swimming Pool Chemicals, Deck cleaners, Wood Preservative
- Aerosol cans, not empty
- Batteries-all kinds, except alkaline batteries (AAA, AA, etc)
 Lithium batteries need to be taped on both sides.
- Fluorescent light bulbs and ballasts. Do not crush bulbs.
- Items containing Mercury
