In 2016, the Water Utility worked on numerous projects throughout the city to ensure water quality for residents. Specifically, the Operations and Maintenance Crew cleaned and lined pipes at Valley Avenue and Jackson Street, replacing old pipes with lined pipes which ensures quality water for the residents.



The Storm Water Utility is responsible for maintaining the City of Marion's storm systems, inlets, manholes, lift stations, sweeping and removing debris from city streets, as well as reducing the amount of CSOs (Combined Sewer Overflows) per year.

The Wastewater Utility is responsible for treating wastewater through physical and biological processes. In 2016, the Treatment Plant underwent major upgrades to some of its equipment which will help the Wastewater facility function in the long-run. Specifically, a new CHP (Combined Heat and Power) Generator was installed, which will generate heat and electricity to help run the entire Treatment Plant, saving energy and reducing cost.

In 2013, our employees established and implemented H2O Community to give struggling families a chance to make ends meet.
